

## Challenge Tour Regulations 2023

### I. Challenge Tour 2023: Rules of Attribution of Invites for Pro's

- Only professionals with the Belgian Nationality or in process of naturalization are eligible.
- Players have to hand in their calendar & objectives at the beginning of the year.
- If during the season 2023, an amateur within the top 150 of the WAGR becomes professional, he could immediately receive invites.
- Players outside the top 150 of the WAGR must play the Qualifying School in order to get a category on one of the professional tours. Exceptions can be made depending on when the amateur turns professional and how many invites are available.
- Minimum required category is Cat 7 on the Alps Tour/Pro Golf Tour or Cat 17 on Challenge Tour.
- Maximum of 3 years support on invites. This can be extended with 2 more years if positive progress is made after a yearly evaluation.

According to the number of received invites for Challenge Tour events outside Belgium, on basis of the players' categories 2023 and their objectives, the attribution order will be:

- a) Players withholding a Challenge Tour Category, order by category
- b) Amateur players inside the Top 150
- c) Players withholding an Alps Tour or Pro Golf Tour order by category
- d) Players turning professional in 2023

In case a player that has received an invite for a tournament, can enter the tournament by his category, the invite will go to the 1<sup>st</sup> reserve for the invite, etc.

Note 1: Any player that accepts invites for 2023 must play the B-NL Challenge Trophy and the Omnium Classic of Belgium (exempted if playing an important tournament for the ranking of their main Tour).

### II. B-NL Challenge Trophy 2023: Rules of attribution of available spots

#### ATTRIBUTION of spots for the Professionals (max 6)

- a) If needed the players on the Challenge Tour
- b) Players on a Satellite Tour (Min Cat 7 Alps Tour/Pro Golf Tour)
- c) Remaining spots: Wild Cards at the discretion of the Royal Belgian Golf Federation
